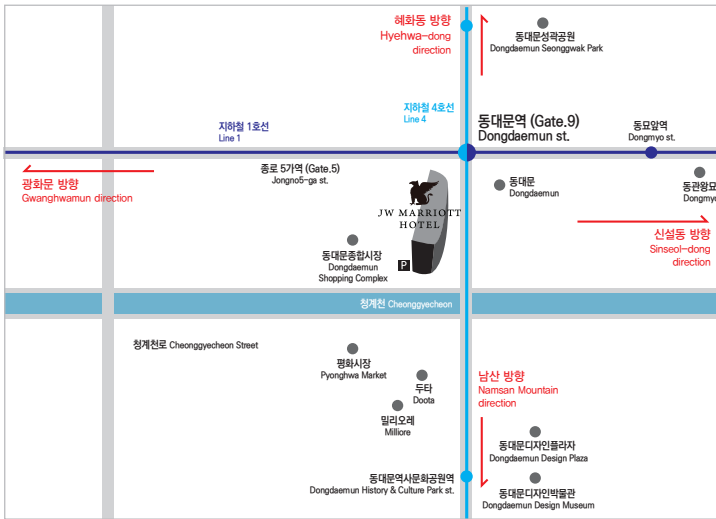


## Directions : JW Marriott Dongdaemun Square, Seoul
